I am very pleased to present the annual report of 2022-23. Along with the Day schools, Night Schools started soon after the receding impact of Covid-19. All the activities of the Night School were conducted offline.

During 2022-23, we have scaled up to 95 Night Schools across Mumbai & Maharashtra and reached to 8,998 students through the Night School Transformation Program. And as far as the Evening Learning Centers (ELC) are concerned, we have scaled up to 21 ELCs from 15 ELCs in 2022-23. Additionally, we have signed a MOU with the Uttarakhand State Government to set up ELCs there. Through the ELC program, we have been able to reach to 1,364 out-of-school youths in Maharashtra, Gujarat, and Uttarakhand.

We are happy to share that the overall SSC pass rate of Masoom supported 95 Night Schools is 80%. The total number of students who appeared for the SSC board exam in 2022-2023 from these 95 Night Schools were 1,567 students, of which 1,253 students have passed. 16 Night Schools recorded a 100% pass rate while 14 Night Schools have secured above 90% pass percentage.

Our Evening Learning Centers were fully operational across Gujarat, Maharashtra & Uttarakhand with overall 21 centers. From the Evening Learning Centers, total 526 students (Maharashtra 352 & Gujarat 174) appeared for the SSC board exam out of which 361 students passed. Maharashtra ELC's overall pass rate is 81.53% while Gujarat ELCs result is 59%. We would like to dedicate the success of this SSC results to all the stakeholders, Trustees, Headmasters, Teachers, Government officials and to the students for their efforts.

Last year our Career Cell department played a significant role in imparting skilling to maximum number of students. A total of 685 students benefitted with long term as well as short term skilling courses and of the above 210 were placed across different sectors. We have started an Entrepreneurship Development Program (EDP) to provide incubation and seed funding support to emerging entrepreneurs from Night Schools. A total of 40 students have undergone EDP last year and 16 students have successfully set up their enterprises.

Through the 3 Tech On Wheel (TOW) buses, we reached out to 1,614 students from Day Schools, Night Schools & Communities in the academic year 2022-23. Another bus has joined the fleet, which makes the count to 4 functional TOW buses. It will be used for imparting computer education to Aarey Pada tribal students which is amidst a forest & hilly area in Mumbai. It has already started its operation.

The Third-Party Assessment of all our 4 verticals has been done through Social Lens. While X Leap organisation has done capacity building evaluation of the Masoom team & organisation and suggested OKR for further improvement of people, processes and technology.

We express our deep gratitude to all our donors, well-wishers and volunteers who believed in our cause and have supported us. Without them, it would be impossible to reach out to our students. We look forward to work with all our stakeholders with the same enthusiasm in the next year.

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
HISTORY OF MASOOM

The lack of infrastructure and resources are serious impediments to the efficient learning of Night School students. Based on the conclusions of the research, Nikita and her research team identified an opportunity to form an organisation through which the problems of Night Schools could be addressed.

Masoom was set up in 2008 and initiated a pilot intervention program in 2 Night Schools for the academic year 2008-2009. Currently, we are working in 95 Night Schools across Mumbai, Pune, Ahmednagar, and Nagpur. We plan to reach 161 Night Schools by 2025, impacting an estimated 25,000 Night School students in Maharashtra.

Masoom aims to establish Quality Education in Night Schools, through its Night School Transformation Program (NSTP). The Program is specially designed to meet the needs of Night Schools and its individual students. It is based on a 3- pronged intervention model consisting of interdependent focus areas for school transformation, namely Education Infrastructure and Inputs, Capacity Building for all Stakeholders, and Advocacy. Masoom's Night School Transformation Program has been designed such that it can be easily replicated and implemented in schools and states across India.

In addition to the NSTP, we also have three other verticals- The Career Cell, Tech On Wheels, and Evening Learning Centers (ELC). The Career Cell was established in 2012-13, that focuses on skilling and employment for Night School students. The Tech on Wheels program was designed in 2015-16 to impart technology courses through well-equipped buses to underprivileged students in Day and Night Schools. The Evening Learning Center was established in 2019-20 to provide out-of-school adolescents, and adults to pursue their academic aspirations, in places where there are no formal Night Schools.



NIGHT SCHOOL TRANSFORMATION PROGRAM

Vision- Empower, Strengthen and transform Night Schools to ensure the youth learn better and earn better.

Mission- Enable Night School students to achieve their full potential through educational and policy support, leading to better skills and job opportunities.

The problem that Masoom addresses is the lack of quality educational infrastructure in Night Schools in Mumbai and other parts of Maharashtra state. Most of the Night Schools are operated by private trusts. Government funding is restricted to salary grants. The trusts running the schools look at them as a burden which exhausts their revenues. This is where Masoom steps in.

There are 161-Night Schools across Maharashtra & about 80% Night Schools in Mumbai are being run out of BMC school premises. Students who come to these schools are from an underprivileged background. Their age group varies from 14 to 30 years. Around 15-20% are adults.

Challenges faced by underprivileged youth:

- Day school drop-outs and/or migrants who have to work due to poor finances.
- Priority is on earnings now, rather than gaining qualifications/skills for the long term.
- Anti-social influences in the environment, for example, alcohol/tobacco addiction.
- No access to learning resources such as notebooks, textbooks, science labs, computers, etc.

To overcome these challenges, Masoom has developed a three-pronged model to provide good quality education – called the **Night School Transformation Program (NSTP):**

- Educational infrastructure building and support Masoom provides access to critical educational infrastructure and resources to the students such as nutrition, books, mobile science labs, library books, computers, and audio-visual learning etc.
- Capacity building Masoom works closely with various stakeholders in the school like the School Management & Development Committees, headmasters, teachers, students, parents, community members and non-teaching staff. These stakeholders are empowered with training sessions and workshops which contain elements of quality education, resource raising, active participation and skilling students.
- Advocacy Raising awareness and advocating amongst the public and key decision-makers about the urgent need of
 policy level changes to be made and implemented, which would give the same privileges and facilities to night schools that
 are available in day-schools.

Masoom's model is the only comprehensive model being implemented in the country. Masoom is presently working in 95 Night Schools of Maharashtra and plans to reach out to 161 Night Schools by 2025 impacting 25,000 Night School students in Maharashtra.

EDUCATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE AND SUPPORT


Masoom provides critical educational infrastructure support and resources. This includes basic amenities such as nutrition (evening meals), notebooks, textbooks, mobile science labs, library books, computers and material for audio-visual learning. Braille learning tools are provided to schools that have visually impaired students.

An average attendance for 2022-23 was 52% across these 95 schools.

Note: Due to the pandemic induced lockdowns, there was a drop-in attendance as most of the students had migrated to their hometowns.

Notebooks and Textbooks: 16,471 Notebooks were distributed (8,266 raised by individual Donors/SMDC and 8,205 by Masoom) across 95 Night Schools and 1,292 Textbook sets for class 9th (138 raised by Individual Donors/SMDC, 441 by School Book Bank and 713 by Masoom) and 1,579 sets for class 10th (150 raised by Individual Donor/SMDC, 783 by school book bank and 646 by Masoom).





Nutrition: We provided nutritious cooked food (Pulao, Dal khichdi, Upma, Poha, Chana Masala, Lapsi, etc.) as well as dry snacks packets to Night School students in Mumbai and other parts of Maharashtra. Most of these students attend Night School straight after their jobs as they are employed on daily wages or in the unorganized sector. As a result, the nutrition provided helped these students to concentrate and focus on their education. Approximately 3,000 students received nutrition throughout the year.

Concept Development Program Session/Science Practical: As Night Schools do not have access to science laboratories, Masoom has provided Mobile Science laboratories to all our Night Schools and the required science material was replenished. A total of 2,590 CDP (Concept Development Program) sessions were conducted across 94 schools benefiting 3,933 students. Practical learning helped students score higher marks in their examinations





E-learning Session: Audio-visual sessions enhance students' learning and improve their analytical thinking. A total of 5,821 E-learning sessions were organised for all subjects that benefited 3,933 students over the entire year from 94 schools.

Library Session: A total of 2,325 library sessions were conducted for 2,187 students of 8th & 9th grade in 93 Night Schools. These sessions generate and sustain interest in reading books that are outside their syllabus.

Capacity Building of Masoom Staff

Masoom conducted staff capacity-building trainings which helped them strengthen their skill sets which enriched their learnings. The training was focused on increasing their awareness of the NSTP vertical, child protection policy, MIS (Management Information System), HR policy, and various other topics. Masoom team's concerns were also addressed. Internal staff training and briefings are held at the office on a regular basis for the program team to reaffirm the plan for improving SSC results. We scheduled a seminar on child sexual abuse for staff on November 20, 2022. The primary goal of the training was to raise awareness about child sexual abuse and to build the capability on handling such situations if the need arises. Our partner NGO Rubaroo conducted this training and we are grateful to them.

ADVOCACY FOR NSTP

Advocacy is a very important component and poses a significant challenge for the Masoom program. We held regular meetings with BMC officials and state government representatives to build a cohesive and fruitful relationship with them.

State Council of Educational Research & Training (SCERT) Maharashtra had issued a circular restraining NGOs/Institutes/Individuals from conducting training programs in Government/Government aided schools. We could not conduct any activities (SMDC, Alumni) in the schools from February to May 2022. With constant follow-ups with the officials and fulfilling all the requirements, SCERT has now successfully granted permission to implement the program in Night Schools to Masoom.

Meeting with Ms. Kesarkar (State Education Minister)

The objectives of the meeting was to renew the MOU implementing Masoom's NSTP vertical across Maharashtra and to resolve the issue of reduction in the number of teachers in Night Schools.

We were also fortunate to get an opportunity to present Masoom's work to the Hon. Governor, Mr. Ramesh Bais. He appreciated Masoom's work with regards to the Night Schools.

As a result of constant meetings with BMC officials, Night Schools have been given access to use playgrounds and classrooms on Sundays and public holidays in BMC schools.

GRADING OF SCHOOLS


Masoom's grading tool is designed to regularly assess schools on various parameters that assign schools into 4 categories –D, C, B and A (lowest to highest). An ideal school is assigned Grade A, while a school that requires improvement in all areas is assigned Grade D. (When Masoom starts a Night School on the premises of a new BMC School, it by default, gets the 'D' grade. We then establish and keep upgrading facilities towards achieving the coveted 'A' grade). Masoom targets to upgrade all schools to Grade A – an ideal school with the best quality teaching, infrastructure and one that is self-sustainable through its School Management Development Committee (SMDC). On December 5, 2017 Masoom signed a 3-year partnership with the State Government of Maharashtra, wherein Masoom was required to align its grading tool in line with the Shala Siddhi tool of the State Government. This tool lays emphasis on outcome based parameters such as enrolment, attendance and academic performance. The upgraded tool has helped Masoom enhance efficiency with its program implementation by involving government stakeholders in its NSTP.

This year we further customised the grading tool by reducing the questions & making it very relevant for the Night Schools conditions. The revised grading tool comprises of 76 questions instead of 106 questions which were a part of the earlier version. End line of March 2023 is based on this customised grading.

This standardized assessment tool has 6 domains, 28 components, 76 questions and 100 Marks for evaluation and 6 major indicators:

- 1. Enabling Resources of School: Availability, Adequacy and Usability
- 2. Teaching-learning and Assessment
- 3. Learners' Progress, Attainment and Development
- 4. School Leadership and Management
- 5. Inclusion, Health and Safety
- 6. Productive Community Participation: This component is as per SHALA SIDDHI

SSC results were declared in the month of June. The average pass percentage of 95 Night Schools associated with Masoom is 80%. The total number of students who appeared from 95-Night Schools were 1,567 students out of which 1,253 students passed.



Activities conducted under the SSC Improvement Program

Mentor Sessions:

Expert teachers (moderators) conducted Mentor sessions for subject teachers of Masoom supported 95 schools. Mentors (Subject Experts) provided guidance to teachers by illustrating innovative teaching ideas for the new (revised) syllabus, discussed the paper pattern as well as provided tips to guide students to write correct answers in order to score high marks. They also coached students on the usage of educational videos as a Teaching Learning Method.

Moderator Sessions

Masoom conducted Moderator sessions from December to March to assist students prepare better for their board exams. Moderators are school teachers with at least 10 years of experience in assessing SSC Board papers. The goal was to train students in time management, guide them through the SSC marking system, simplify the way to write answers for below-average students, and guide above-average students to score high marks by using educational videos as a Teaching Learning Method. Masoom organized 432 Moderator sessions in 83 Night Schools from December 2022 to March 2023, as required. Teachers who were not moderators also guided the students in their own capacity

Extra Classes on Sundays / Holidays

Masoom organised SSC extra classes (online) in 95 Night Schools for revision of the curriculum. The duration of the classes was 4 hours and they were held on public holidays and Sundays. All the subjects including Social Science were covered. 80% content was provided for Mathematics, Science and English. The classes were conducted by School Leaders and Teachers. Masoom also provided expert teachers as and when required. The average daily attendance for the extra classes was 950. A total of 1,260 Expert Teachers sessions for SSC students were scheduled across 95 Night Schools.



Focus Students Classes

Masoom organised 5 centers for focussed students' classes. Those struggling to pass in 2-3 subjects were admitted. They were held on 12th, 19th and 26th February (Sundays) from 10 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. These sessions most importantly included paper solving practice. Students were provided a traveling allowance and were served light lunch. A total of 438 students took advantage of these focus sessions.

Bright Students' Classes


These classes are specifically targeted to improve the performance of students who score more than 60% during their SSC exam. Baseline exam was conducted to select the bright students. Masoom conducted 2 extra batches online for Marathi and Hindi medium bright students. Subject wise resource persons were appointed to improve learning and to clear student doubts. Approximately, 72 students attended our classes. Bright student classes were conducted from September till the board exams in March 2023.

21 Apekshit Sets

Navneet 21 Apekshit sets is a ready reckoner guide for 10th grade revision. These books contain all probable questions likely to be a part of the examination. This helps students to be better prepared, confident and score better marks. We provided Apekshit sets to 1,433 students. Masoom teachers ensured regular and rigorous practice using Apekshit sets.

Open Book Test & Preliminary Examinations

We conducted two practice exams for students appearing for their SSC examination. In December, an open-book test was conducted. Masoom provided 2,014 question sets, 15,634 answer sheets, and 6,584 supplements. Students used textbooks to solve these open book tests. The purpose of this exam is for students to answer all questions. The preliminary examination was held in January. Masoom provided 1,771 question sets, 15,662 answer sheets, and 3,572 supplements. The question and answer papers were set as per the board examination pattern. Hence, students received hands-on practice.



Worksheets

We initiated the worksheet program for students. Masoom provided 38 worksheets for 20 marks (MCQ) for 10th Grade students across all mediums, including Marathi, Hindi, English, Urdu, and Kannada. Students realised the importance of worksheets if attempted on a regular basis. Worksheets program were conducted from September 2022 to February 2023.

Class Teacher Meeting

In order to give a fill-up to learning outcomes, Masoom organised a discussion with SSC class teachers on 23rd December 2022. The teachers were encouraged to put in more effort to improve the performance of SSC students in Board exams. This meeting was crucial for the school to find ways to achieve the target set by Masoom. A total of 62 teachers were present for the session.

Appointment of School Leaders/ Backup Teachers

Most Night Schools are facing a shortage of teachers after the implementation of the new staffing policy and appointment of day teachers in Night Schools. Schools have a shortage of teachers, and lack subject wise teachers. Sometimes the syllabus is incomplete even before the board exam in March. This affects the quality of education as well as their SSC (Secondary School Certificate) results. All these factors result in students losing interest in attending school regularly and a decrease in SSC pass percentage. To deal with the issue of non-availability of teachers, Masoom decided to provide one School Leader per school. The school leaders played a very important role in the implementation of NSTP. They divided their time between Masoom's admin work in school as well as actual classroom teaching. 50% time was given to classroom teaching and 50% time was given to conducting NSTP activities in school. Masoom appointed 77 School Leaders. Many schools lacked subject wise teachers even after providing one School Leader. Masoom appointed a total of 44 subject wise teachers as per the needs of the schools

EVENTS & ACTIVITIES

Annual Event

Masoom conducted its Annual Day function on 6th August 2022. We celebrated the success of Class 10 students with Headmasters, Teachers and Night Schools (100% results), advisory committee and more. The 600+ audience was enthralled by performances, listened to panel discussions and was eager to go on stage to receive their awards. The program was anchored by Masoom's staff and Core committee members.





The awardees were 3 Toppers from Night Schools, 15 schools received 100% results award, 72 topper students award, 11 Teachers (subject teachers), and 5 advisory committee members. A similar event was held at Nagpur for our Night schools on 13th August and at Ahmednagar on 18th August 2022. We thank our Donors, supporters, students, teachers, Head masters and Trustees of all Night Schools. This event showcases the success of our students thus encouraging the students of 9th and 10th grade to continue being motivated to complete their education.

Annual Sports

Masoom organised its most awaited Annual Inter Night School Sports Event on 12th, 13th and 14th December 2022. More than 1,300 students from 74 Night Schools across Mumbai participated in the 3-day event. The boys' teams played Kabaddi and the girls' teams played Dodge Ball. Running races of 100 meters for boys and 50 meters for girls were also organised.

The competitions were conducted zone wise at three locations simultaneously on the first 2 days. Kabaddi matches and boys running competitions were held on December 12th, while girls Dodge Ball and running contests were held on December 13th 2022. The winners competed in the finals on December 14th 2022.



The winners were: Sakshi Kannojiya First place in Girls Running, Anil Sote First place in Boys running, Sharda Night School stood 1st in the Dodge Ball competition and Sadguru Night School won the Kabaddi competition.

A similar event was held for Ahmednagar and Pune schools. 3 schools participated in Ahmednagar and 2 schools participated in Pune. Our Annual Sports event brought about healthy competitiveness among students resulting in developing the spirit of sportsmanship among them.

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Educational Visit to Deutsche Bank

A visit to Deutsche Bank was organised for students to get an idea of the workings of a bank. 28 Night School students of 8th and 9th grade were part of the visit. Staff volunteers of Deutsche Bank explained the fundamentals of the banking system, including NEFT and RTGS as well as ATM machines. Students gained a valuable insight into the economic and banking system.





Educational Visit to Nehru Planetarium

Organised for 8th and 9th grade students of Deutsche Bank supported Night Schools. Their staff volunteers accompanied the students. This field visit enhanced the teaching of science from the classroom and made it more relatable through the audio-visual activities. Receiving a practical experience of science, geography, and history helped them comprehend the subjects better. It was an incredible experience that brought their understanding to the next level.

Organised for donors to interact face-to-face with beneficiary students and stakeholders of Night Schools. A discussion between students and stakeholders was facilitated by our donors. Representatives from Bajaj, HCL, Ajuntament de Barcelona, Deutsche Bank, Elkem and Yardi were in attendance. We are thankful to the donors who graced this event and engaged with our students, alumni and stakeholders.



VISUALLY CHALLENGED STUDENTS' PROGRAM

Enrolment and Support

Visually impaired students are enrolled in Maratha Mandir Night School supported by Masoom. A majority of the students are from rural areas. These institutes are supported by the government and provide stipends to students pursuing skill training. Masoom met students and informed them about Night Schools where they can complete SSC.

In the academic year 2022-23, a total of 9 visually impaired students took admission in Maratha Mandir Night School, Worli, Mumbai.

Examination Writers

4 visually impaired students passed their SSC examination this academic year. Masoom provided them with writers for their exams and distributing walking sticks.

Masoom conducted a workshop on the technique of book binding for the 10th grade students.

We have appointed a special teacher Ms. Jayashree for visually challenged students. She teaches the syllabus as well as conducts the activities such as Sports, Braille writing, etc.

This teacher and the visually challenged students' program along with the school has been supported by Australia and New Zealand Banking Group Limited (ANZ) since 2011-12.







CAREER CELL

Theory of Problem

Night School students neither have any inkling about numerous career prospects emerging in the 21st century, nor the financial wherewithal to pursue these. Bright students with potential are left doing menial jobs, far below their potential. The country / society is poorer for this, as it is unable to harness the budding talent of its youngsters. Many students wish to be become entrepreneurs by running small businesses but are unable to scale up. Students, mostly from the age group of 18-30 years from underprivileged families, have a lot of family responsibilities and are therefore keen to avail better educational opportunities to improve their lot.

Theory of Change

Masoom provides short-term and long-term skilling courses, placements, and support to set up an enterprise for students after 10th grade.

The Career Cell was established by Masoom in 2012-13, to help Night School students in making the right decision about their career. Initially, the Career Cell focused on making the Night School students aware of various Career options available to them after passing SSC and providing them information about the institutes offering various skilling courses. Very soon it was realized that the students also need financial support to take vocational training or go for higher education in spite of scoring well in exams. They could not achieve their full potential if they were not provided financial support and continuous guidance. Masoom started providing scholarships for deserving students to pursue short-term (duration from 1 month to 18 months) vocational/skilling courses, long term higher education or professional education (duration more than 18 months) as well as for Entrepreneurship Development Program (duration more than 12 months).

Activities

Career Guidance Sessions

Career Guidance sessions were held in 95 Night Schools, addressing 1,882 students through the Career Cell team. These students also received one-on-one career guidance via phone calls by the Career Cell department. They were guided about various career options after completion of their SSC & HSC exams.





Long Term Skilling Courses

The long-term courses are professional courses, and hence, are not conducted in-house. Interested students, selected on merit, are put in touch with various professional institutes that run these courses. A total of 142 students (94 boys and 48 girls) were provided support for long-term professional courses. These courses included hotel management, Physiotherapy, Engineering, BBA, BCA, BMS, CS, CA, CMA, MBA, MSW, and Ph.D., etc. A total of 56 students successfully completed their courses and 21 of these received placement.

Masoom Career Cell department provided Gautam with a 75% scholarship for M.Com. degree course and CA (Chartered Accountant) exam. Currently, he is working in IDBI Finance Ltd as a Finance Executive earning Rs. 55,000/- per month.

Short Term Skilling Courses -

The purpose is to enable Night School alumni students to attend vocational courses. These short-term courses are conducted over a period of 3-18 months. These are job-oriented courses that enables a student to improve their employment prospects. Masoom started providing scholarships for deserving students to pursue short term vocational/skilling courses. During the year 2022-23, Masoom's Career Cell provided scholarships to 542 students (305 boys and 237 girls) to do short-term courses such as Nursing, Electrician, Computer Application, Fashion design, Hair styling, Beauty parlour, Fire and safety management, Cargo handling etc. Total 390 students completed their courses and 210 students received placements.

Neha secured 90% Short term scholarship support for her Travel and Tourism course at IATC Aviation Institute, Kurla. Currently she is working at AIR India as a Customer Service Executive and earning Rs.21,300/- per month.



Entrepreneurship Development Program

This is an in-house incubation program for Entrepreneurs designed by our own team. Through this program, we aim to build entrepreneurial skills for those who wish to start their enterprises or upgrade the skills of those who are currently running small-scale businesses. After the completion of the course, we support them with seed capital, while 10% will be the beneficiaries' contribution. We provided 40 students (18 boys and 22 girls) with support under this Program such as eService, Photographer, Vada pav stall, Beauty parlour, Garment shops, Tailoring shop, Poultry farm, Electrician, etc. A total of 20 students have successfully set up their enterprises.

Ratna has been supported by Masoom Career Cell department with a 90% scholarship for a Fashion Designing course as well as the Entrepreneurship Development Program. She has won the Rang De Groundbreakers Contest, received Rs. 50,000/- cash prize and opened a Tailoring shop in Chembur.

Job Placements

Candidates who successfully complete their courses are placed in various companies. So far, we have placed 210 students. Their pay package has increased from Rs. 6,000/- to Rs. 12,000/. Due to the pandemic, students of the previous year are still completing their courses and placements are also in process.



EXTRA ACTIVITIES

Webinars

Career Cell organised webinars for students - Approximately 22 Institutes participated in the webinar. The Career Cell team worked actively by mobilizing and creating awareness using social media platforms such as Facebook, WhatsApp groups, etc.

Students gained greater understanding of the fields related to their area of interest and aptitude.





Job Fair

Masoom organised Job Fairs for students by involving 12 placement agencies at our office. Students were able to browse through employment opportunities at these job fairs. A total 85 students were successfully placed.

Zoom meeting with our Institute Partners

In these meetings, we did a deep dive of training progress reports of students, their attendance, their placement details, and several success stories of Masoom. We also discussed the upcoming months process as well as new challenges faced by the institute. A total 30 zoom meetings took place.





Training Institute Visits

The Career Cell team visited around 35 institutes for collaboration, monitoring progress, as well as coordinating with students and staff regarding their course completion, challenges, placement opportunities, Institute mapping, and other related activities. These institute visits are important to track students' attendance to find out if they're regularly attending the course and benefitting from the same. The average attendance of students was 90%.

TECH ON WHEELS (TOW)

Theory of Problem

Learning computers is crucial for advancement in this century. However, Night School students do not have access to computer labs in their school premises. Most of them are not able to afford the fees of private computer training institutions. Hence, they are at a great disadvantage, when they enter the job market.

Theory of Change

Masoom launched Tech-on-Wheels (TOW) buses to provide access of computer education and exposure to other IT courses.


This project started in 2015-16 to provide Night School students with the opportunity to learn computers by exposing them to IT related courses. The Tech on Wheels bus provides Night School students with access to computers, online resources and innovative educational programming that will open doors to a bright future and will act as a unique platform for students learning. The project helps students develop digital literacy and 21st century skills.


This program is operated through three well-equipped specially designed buses that provide computer access to 28 students per class. We currently have 3 buses operational, 2 in Mumbai and 1 in Nagpur.

Some of the courses conducted through the bus are -

- 1. Web Designing
- 2. Digital Literacy
- 3. Basic Computer Skills
- 4. Mobile Application Development
- 5. Graphic Designing

We conducted classes in Mumbai and Nagpur for Night Schools, Communities and Day School students. A total of 1,614 (696 of Mumbai and 918 of Nagpur) students benefited from these courses.





OTHER ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN BY THE TOW TEAM:

- The bus was used for Enrolment drives in Mumbai & Nagpur.
- Mr. Shashi, Mr. Ricardo, and Mr. Sumeet from PenFed visited the TOW bus in Nagpur and interacted with our students.
- TOW program was presented in SNDT women's university on the International Digital Literacy Day.
- Awareness drives about the TOW program were conducted at the Mahila Sangh English Primary School and Lions Juhu Nandalal Jalan Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Vile Parle.
- Our buses undergo regular maintenance; have updated CCTV cameras, installed reverse cameras, new carpets, inverters, etc.

OUTCOMES

- Over 2,100+ students from Day, Night School & communities have been provided with Digital courses through TOW.
- Some students who have completed digital courses from TOW are planning to further their careers in the IT field.
- With the introduction of the TOW bus at Nalanda Night School, Borivali, the attendance at the school has increased.
- The TOW bus has been used for enrolment drives in Aarey Pada and other areas.

WAY AHEAD

We have converted a tempo traveller vehicle into a Mini Tech on Wheels Bus. It will be used for imparting computer education to tribal students of Aarey Pada which is amidst the forest & hilly areas of Mumbai and cannot be accessed by the large buses. It will be operational from the next academic year 2023-24.







EVENING LEARNING CENTER (ELC)

Vision -

To educate all Out-of-School adolescents/adults through a formal/informal model of education.

Mission -

Enable Out-of-School students to achieve their full potential by providing educational support, developing skills, and helping with job opportunities.

Theory of Problem

There are 3.2 crore out-of-school adolescents and adults according to the New Education Policy - 2020 in India. They do not have a second chance to come back to school to complete the 10th grade. Some students are forced to take up employment due to poor financial conditions and some drop out due to poor quality of teaching and learning. Although working, these adolescents have a strong desire to complete their education. However, due to lack of flexible platforms and learning spaces, they are unable to complete their 10th grade.

Theory of Change

But if we provide a formal/informal platform to educate (Pass Class 10) Out-of-School adolescents/adults, then we will build a strong academic foundation which will lead to better jobs and a better standard of living.

Masoom started the Evening Learning Center (ELC) vertical in 2019-20 which offers a flexible platform for these students to complete 10th grade. The ELC model is similar to the NSTP model, keeping the focus on supporting students to prepare for their Class 10 exams. This model can be operational with the Government Partnership as well as with the community partnership.

These ELCs will largely focus on catering to the social needs of the students by helping them learn vital life skills, soft skills, and vocational skills where education will be a by-product. ELCs offer one to two years' opportunity to such students to learn holistically and gain life skills along with the Class 10 Certificate.

Masoom wants to implement them across the country. The Evening Learning Center will cater to the needs of out-of-school students/drop-out students, adults and adolescents.

In AY 2022-23, a total of 21 ELCs were operational across 3 states – Maharashtra, Gujarat and Uttarakhand.

In all these ELCs, roughly 70% students are female and 30% are male. A majority of students studying in ELCs are above 28 years of age. Male students mainly work in unorganized sectors like small scale industries or as delivery boys, or in the housekeeping industry. On an average 45% of females are working as housemaids or in the housekeeping industry. Most of the students belong to the slum pockets of the city.

SSC Results

In June 2023, SSC results for Maharashtra and Gujarat were declared. We are happy to announce that 4 of our ELCs achieved 100% results, while Nirman ELC, Pune has set a record by achieving 100% results for the past 3 years. The overall ELC result for Maharashtra is 81.53% and for Gujarat is 59%.

NIOS (Uttarakhand)

As per the mandate of the Uttarakhand Education department, only after students complete their 9th grade as a private candidate, can they appear for the SSC exam in the next academic year. However, we have a few students who have previously studied till 4th grade or up to 9th grade. Masoom is closely working with the Uttarakhand Education Department to develop / influence policy decisions. Students will be appearing for SSC through NIOS (National Institute of Open Schooling). We have students of 3 ELCs who will be appearing for SSC through NIOS - Brahmpuri ELC, Rajiv Nagar ELC and Govindgarh ELC in Dehradun, Uttarakhand.

ANNUAL ACTIVITIES

Enrolment Drive

Enrolment drives were conducted both offline and online, resulting in the enrolment of 1,302 students. The online method included effective use of social media where Google forms were circulated, while the offline method involved staff visiting the communities for door-to-door surveys, meetings, distributing pamphlets, and placing stickers in the chosen localities. These methods created awareness in surrounding areas and communities which aided in increased enrolments for the academic year 2022-23.





Material distribution

Educational materials were distributed from center to center, which included Foundation books, SSC Textbooks, Notebooks, Science Journals, and 21 Apekshit Sanch. These aided the learning of students.

Concept Development Program Session (CDP) & E-learning Session

For our SSC students, we conducted Science practicals, as part of their board exam preparation. A total of 120 sessions were conducted for the Maharashtra board - Mumbai and Pune ELCs. Since this was not a mandate for the Gujarat and Uttarakhand state boards, no science practicals were conducted there. E-learning sessions were conducted in ELCs of Maharashtra and Gujarat. A total of 372 sessions were conducted this year. These sessions helped students develop skills as well as build confidence.





Open Day

We conducted 3 open days after each exam. We invited students' parents/family members to review their progress and appreciate their efforts. Teachers too, discussed students' academic journeys with a particular focus on challenges faced and the means to overcome them. Open days had a noticeable impact on attendance of the SSC batch, which increased from 10% to a whopping 85% or above.

Financial Literacy Session

A session on financial literacy was conducted for students, where basic information about savings, its importance, and methods, the difference between needs and wants, etc. were explained. This session was conducted for current students as well as for alumni. A total of 911 current batch students and 700 alumni attended this session. It helped inculcate the habit of regular savings and curtail unnecessary/wasteful expenditures.





Moderator Sessions

We organised Moderator sessions for students in February 2023, where subject experts conducted sessions discussing techniques for writing board papers for particular subjects. They also guided students about the content on which they ought to focus more. For every center, we conducted 6 sessions. These moderators are either paper setters or have more than 20 years of experience in teaching. These sessions are invaluable to students' preparation.

Mentor Sessions

For capacity enhancement of teachers, we held mentor sessions (subject matter expert) for Maths, English and Science, where subject experts guided teachers about the content, to clear their doubts, answer queries and impart techniques with regards to solving board papers.

SSC Farewell

To convey our best wishes to SSC students, we arranged the SSC farewell program in February 2023 in Maharashtra and Gujarat ELCs, where fun-filled activities were organised for students. Teachers and students shared their experiences. Students received gifts followed by refreshments.

Leadership Session

As part of a pilot project, Masoom Fellowship program, we appointed youths as fellows in some centers. Fellows are responsible for parents and community engagement for non-academic development of students. We appointed three fellows (one for each state). Every Friday was a non-academic day, where fellows conducted 2 hours leadership sessions for students. The topics included meaning of leadership, values of leadership, SWOT analysis of self and group, etc. A total of 8 sessions were conducted till March 2023. Students also learnt about where to file a complaint if something unjust happens to / around them.

Formation of Alumni group

Alumni groups were formed in the ELCs that have at least one batch that has completed their grade 10. We had 3 alumni meetings. In the first meeting we introduced them to the concept, and their roles and responsibilities. In the second meeting, we held a financial literacy session. The third meeting was focused on the enrolment drive. It is observed that in all the ELCs more than 40% new enrolment was done by Alumni students.

Formation of CMDC

A Community Management and Development Committee (CMDC) was formed, where current students, teachers, alumni and well-wishers from the community are involved. Two meetings were conducted in all ELCs till March 2023. The agenda of the first meeting was to interact informally with the members and delineate their roles and responsibilities, while the second meeting focused on sharing students' marks and finalising the SSC students list. This resulted in creating awareness among stakeholders about the ELC concept and their role for the development of ELC.

Scaling up ELCs in Uttarakhand

In 2022-23, Masoom signed a five year MOU with the Samagra Siksha Abhiyan department, Uttarakhand to start the scale up of ELCs in the Uttarakhand state. In January 2023, we established three ELCs in the Dehradun city, and within two months, achieved our enrolment targets as mentioned below:

ADVOCACY FOR ELC

Following an invitation from the Education department of Uttarakhand, Masoom signed a MOU with them in July 2022 for 3 years to start and scale up ELCs across the state. As a pilot, 3 ELCs were started in Uttarakhand in September 2022.

Masoom had also connected with the Telangana and Andhra Pradesh governments for scaling up ELCs there. Currently we are gathering data and onboarding donors for both these states.

DEO of Bhavnagar, Gujarat connected a donor to support the ELC program. We are thankful for their support.

We have MOUs with the Government of Uttarakhand and Gujarat to set up ELCs in these 2 states. Infrastructure support has been provided by the government as well.

For Advocating ELCs and to scale them up across the nation, we conducted a National Conference. We had participation of 12 NGOs from 9 states. The agenda was to bring likeminded NGOs on a common platform, build common understanding and get groups of NGOs together to work on drop out / out of school youth issues. These NGOs can be partners in replicating the ELC models across the Nation.





WAY AHEAD

In 2023-24, the NSTP program will be implemented in 100 Night Schools and the SSC result improvement program in 29 NMC schools in Nagpur.

We intend to run a total of 27 Evening Learning Centers across Maharashtra, Gujarat and Uttarakhand in the next academic year. We will explore the NIOS syllabus for Uttarakhand ELCs. We have started online ELCs in Pune for SSC students on a pilot basis. Simultaneously, we have also started offline ELCs for HSC (Arts stream) students.

Through webinars & career counselling we will reach more than 3,000 students. We will provide skilling to over 790 students and entrepreneurship support to 42 students through our Career Cell.

The TOW project will deliver digital courses to over 2,000 students, through 2 TOW buses. Our mini bus is also equipped to impart computer education to underprivileged students in Aarey Pada.

We will use software across the board. It will aid in the simplification of the monitoring and evaluation system.

Masoom will be organising a National level conference in Maharashtra to facilitate building a network among the government, NGOs and students. The objective will be to create a local governance system for implementing various government schemes and policies and providing access to quality education for out-of-school students.

1. BACKGROUND:

M/s Masoom is a charitable trust registered under the Maharashtra Public Trusts Act 1950 vide Regn.No E-24715 dated 14th January, 2008 having PAN AACTM1118K

Further, the above trust has obtained provisional certificate u/s 80G(5) of the Income Tax Act 1961 dated 28th May,2021 vide Application number 34666641300421.

Trust has also obtained FCRA registration with registration number 083781290 vide order dated 17th February, 2022.

The Trust's primary focus is to establish and maintain after school resource centers, night schools and day care creches.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES ADOPTED IN THE PREPARATION AND PRESENTATION OF THE ACCOUNTS :-

a) BASIS OF ACCOUNTING:

These financial statements are prepared under historical cost convention on an accrual basis.

b) USE OF ESTIMATES:

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles requires the trustees to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets, liabilities, revenues and expenses and disclosure of contingent liabilities on the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from the estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognized prospectively in current or future periods.

c) REVENUE RECOGNITION:

Contribution received from the donor is accounted as a corpus donation where the intention of the donor has been specified and a letter to that effect is received from the donor. Otherwise the contribution is treated as ordinary donation and accounted for on the date of receipt.

d) EXPENSES:

All expenses are accounted for on accrual basis except those with significant uncertainties.

e) FIXED ASSETS & DEPRECIATION:

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation on Fixed assets are provided on written down value method under section 32 of the Income tax Act, 1961 and in accordance with and at the rates specified in New Appendix I of the Income tax rules, w.e.f. 02/04/2005.
